Providence House began in 1988 when two members of
First Presbyterian Church, Mary Anne Selber and Jean
Sayres, recognized a need for shelter services for
homeless families with children. Providence House
employs case managers, a professional counselor, a fulltime dietary team, and a full-time teaching staff. The
"House" accommodates up to 27 families (80 people).

The ARC Caddo-Bossier

"Building Unlimited Opportunities for People with Disabilities." The Arc Caddo-Bossier is a private, non-profit agency that provides an array of services and supportive programs for infants, children, and adults with disabilities and their families.

Robinson's Rescue

On September 15, 2008, Robinson's Rescue was founded as the first clinic of its kind in the state of Louisiana and one of only 159 ASPCA Spay/Neuter Alliance clinics in all of the United States. Mission: to prevent pet overpopulation through high-quality, affordable spay and neuter surgeries while educating the community about responsible pet ownership.
